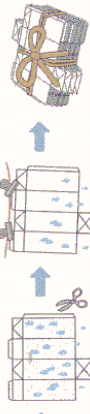

This includes branches of fruit trees, bamboo, and branches with leaves attached. TVs, air-conditioners, washing machines, dryers, refrigerators, 'recyclable', pianos, iron poles (longer than 2 metres), large water heaters, agricultural equipment, bricks, sand, soil, tyres, fire extinguishers, car batteries, concrete slabs, roof tiles, gas cylinders, waste oil, kerosene, paint, explosives, agrochemicals, etc.
